RANC 2012 Player Code of Behaviour – All Players to read and sign off on Indemnity Form

In addition to Netball Australia's General Code of Behaviour as a player you must agree to:

1. Participate because you enjoy it, not just to please parents and coaches
2. Play by the rules – know the rules
3. Participate fairly and safely
4. Abide by decisions, without argument or bad temper
Captains have the right to approach an umpire during an interval for rule clarification. Approach the umpire in a courteous and polite way.
5. Cooperate with your coach, and other players
Verbal abuse of officials or players, deliberate fouling or damaging/throwing equipment is not acceptable.
Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Ensure that at all times your behaviour is fair. Be patient and enthusiastic supporter of fellow players.
6. Applaud all good play by your own team and opponents
7. Be a responsible team member
Always be on time. Encourage and assist all players. Attend all training sessions.
Always bring appropriate uniform and equipment to training/matches.
8. Do not engage in practises that affect sporting performance (alcohol or drug use)
9. Respect and acknowledge the contribution of those who create the opportunity for you to play - Volunteers (scorers, coaches, timekeepers, administrators and umpires).

RANC 2012 Parent/Guardian Code of Behaviour – All Parents/Guardians to read and sign off on Indemnity Form

In addition to Netball Australia's General Code of Behaviour as a parent/guardian you must agree to:

1. If your child is interested, encourage participation in the appropriate netball activity. Do not force an unwilling child. Remember children are involved in netball for their enjoyment, not yours.
2. Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than the overall outcome of the event. This assists your child in setting realistic goals related to ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.
3. Teach your child that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
4. Encourage your child to always play according to the rules.
5. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
6. Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good play by all players.
7. If you disagree with an umpire or coach, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question their judgement and honesty in public.
8. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse.
9. Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer administrators, coaches and umpires.
10. Be a model of good sports behaviour for children to copy.
11. Be courteous in communication with administrators, coaches, players and umpires. Teach children to do likewise.
12. Support the use of age appropriate development activities and modified rules.
